

SDA RULES' ELIGIBILITY PROVISIONS

There are 2 relevant SDA eligibility criteria. If either of these criteria match a participant's circumstances, then there's a case for SDA eligibility to be explored.

Does the participant have an "extreme functional impairment"?

1. Does the participant endure extremely reduced functional capacity affecting their mobility or self-care or self-management? Yes ☐ No ☐

2. Does the participant have a very high need for person to person supports? Yes ☐ No ☐

If answers to both 1 and 2 are yes (not just one of the answers!) then there's a case for SDA eligibility to be explored.

SDA RULES' ELIGIBILITY PROVISIONS

Alternately does the participant have "very high support needs"?

a. Has the participant previously lived in SDA for extended periods and has this impacted the capacity of the participant to transition to alternative living arrangements and supports? Yes ☐ No ☐

If the answer above is yes, then there is a case for SDA eligibility to be explored on the basis of previous accommodation history alone.

b. Does the participant have a very high level need for person to person supports for a significant part of the day? Yes ☐ No ☐
and either;

(i) the participant's informal support network is limited or not sustainable. Yes ☐ No ☐

(ii) the participant is at risk or poses a risk to others, risks which could be mitigated by the provision of SDA. Yes ☐ No ☐

If the answer to b is yes and either the answer to (i) or (ii) is yes, then there is a case for SDA eligibility to be explored.
